# Disruption to club during the Winter

Shortly after Christmas we discovered problems with the electrics then a few days later, water coming through the ceiling.

It turns out we had a family staying with us, a family of squirrels. Unfortunately, they created a lot of damage including biting their way through the plastic heating pipes in the attic, hence the water leaks and chewing their way through the electric cables. This didn't however seem to have any effect on their health!!

We quickly called out a plumber, an electrician and a Pest Controller. We had four different areas of plastic piping at differing points in the attic which needed replacing, the electric cabling which runs from one end of the club house to the other has to be replaced and we have now managed to evict 7 squirrels that had taken up the use of our attic space.

It was unfortunate that we had some disruption over one weekend, but we have managed to keep the building open since. We still need to do some repairs to the exterior of the building to stop any future invaders getting access to the roof space. All in all, it will have cost us a considerable amount of money, approximately £1,400, to get all this sorted.
