Thankfully the weather has been very good to us through the season and members were able to play friendlies. It was at this time Martin Askham and Dave Giles set up a competition for all members of Caer-Glow and the Co-op, and it was named 'Lockdown 2020'. It was based on a league table which meant you were able to play more than one game to qualify, which kept everyone's interest going, and the finals day happened on Saturday 5th September.

The Pairs game was won by Marcia and Martin Askham and the runners up were Chris and Malcolm Williams.

Finances

Some of you might be wondering how we have managed to stay afloat this year.

At the very beginning the Government announced that any 'businesses' that paid business rates would receive a grant to help them through the Covid situation. We were very pleased when we had a grant given to us of £10,000. This money has meant that we have been able to keep our new green keeper, Duncan employed throughout the year and pay our usual running utilities costs. We will be forever grateful for this windfall. It certainly enabled us to sleep easier at night.

Also during this period, the committee applied for a grant, again Covid related and keeping our members safe during this time, and we were lucky enough to be awarded £1,500. We said in our proposal that the purchase of 4 new pushers would support all members but especially those who use walking aids while on the green and have difficulty in gathering the bowls with their feet. We have purchased the pushers so no more having to move the bowls with your feet.

We also requested the funding for 14 new comfy seats inside our clubhouse which would enable our members to continue to use the facilities during the Autumn and Winter, and enable them to be with their friends and socialise. If we are able to open the club house during the Autumn/Winter, we will need seats that can be moved apart, which the bench seats don't allow us to do. This will enable us to meet the safe distancing rules that are required.

We have now purchased these seats and they will be with us by the end of September. We were also fortunate to have sold the old indoor bench seats and with the money we raised from that we have purchased new outdoor 'garden' seats, these will be available for the start of next year's outdoor season.
